The Petersburg Quarry, located near the Ohio-Pennsylvania border, covers approximately 240 acreas, with 50 acreas designated for wildlife habitat management. The main vegetative communities on the site are forests, open



meadows and wetlands. The site is surrounded by rural areas and lies within the Ohio River basin watershed.

Additional Features

Basking logs, raptor perches, eastern blue bird and owl nest boxes

and living space for cavity-nesting bird species, Cub Scouts helped construct eastern bluebird nest boxes and an owl nest box. The site regularly monitors and cleans each box after each nesting season, as the site's nesting boxes exhibit annual activity.

In addition, new basking logs were installed in the pond to provide habitat for semi-aquatice organisms such as turtles, wading birds and frogs, as well as shelter for fish. The pond enhancements have increased the waterfowl and fish population at the site.

Throughout the site, raptor perches were installed to create an elevated, active hunting space neat the raptor nesting areas. Brush piles were also assembled near the perches to provide shelter for small animals that provide food for the birds of prey.

The Petersburg Quarry wildlife habitat site is one of Oldcastle's oldest certified Wildlife Habitat Council (WHC) Wildlife at Work program.
